
## ABOUT US

## Solution

#### **Bring Funding Back**

To reestablish a source of **funding for recycling grants** though our Recycle Florida Today Foundation, Inc. and specialty plate.



# IMPLEMENTATION

The process required legislative action through an approved bill. We began the process in 2022, establishing a Foundation, advocated for legislative support, established an Outreach Committee within the association to educate, promote, and market the specialty plate.



The process took 2-years to gain legislative action and approval.

CS/CS/HB 403: Specialty License Plates

GENERAL BILL by Infrastructure Strategies Committee; Transportation & Modals Subcommittee; Chaney; (CO-INTRODUCERS) Bankson; Bell; Berfield; Caruso; López, J.; Michael; Mooney; Skidmore; Waldron; Yarkosky

Specialty License Plates; Exempts collegiate license plates from certain discontinuation & presale voucher requirements for specialty license plates; requires DHSMV to reauthorize previously discontinued collegiate license plates; renames & revises words appearing on certain plates; directs DHSMV to develop specified plates; provides for distribution & use of fees collected from sale of plates.

# Innovative Project Benefits

Drivers may elect to purchase the new plate for an additional cost of \$32.50, plus fees. \$25 from the sale of each plate will benefit the RFT Foundation. To get the specialty plate, drivers will need to have their Florida driver's license, vehicle registration, and apply in person at an FLHSMV office once the voucher is available.



The Foundation must presale 3,000 vouchers to move the plate to the production phase.

The **Foundation will use the donations** to further recycling and waste reduction throughout Florida through recycling grants to increase public awareness about the importance of recycling, resource conservation, and environmental stewardship; to promote robust, comprehensive, and sustainable recycling programs; and to support the professional development of persons employed in fields relating to recycling, conservation, and sustainability.




Plate Sales	Projected Financial Revenue
